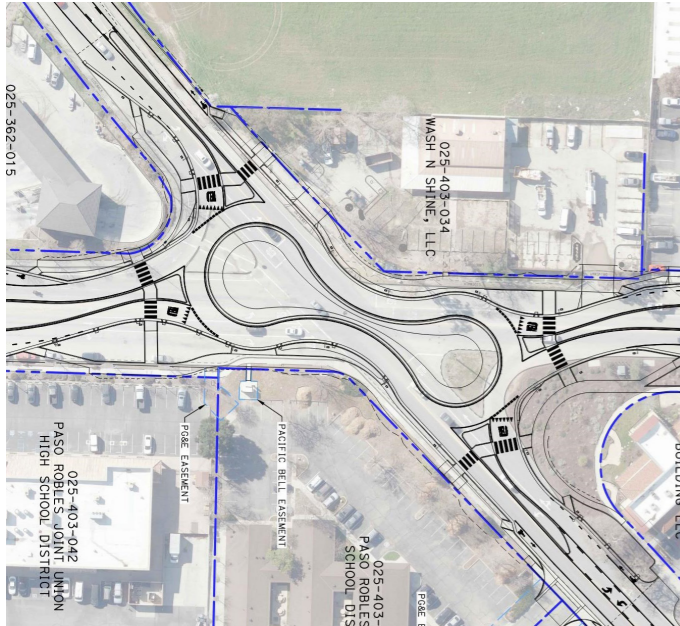


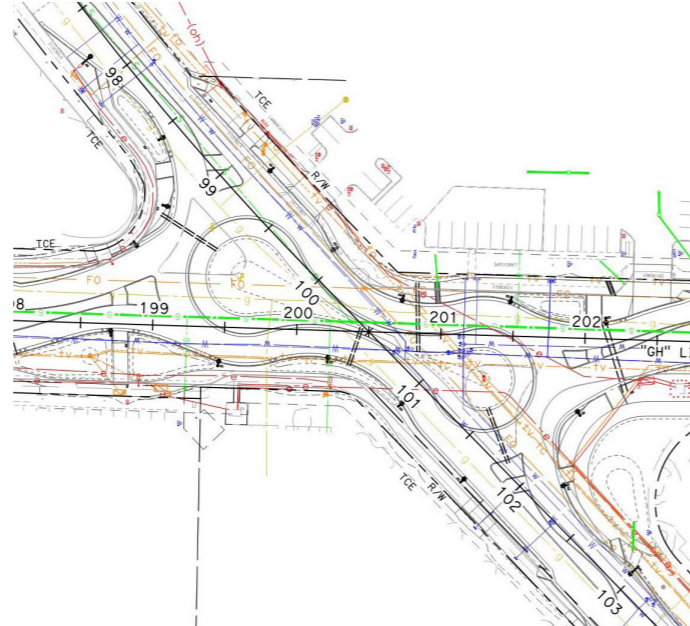

Unique "dog bone" shape provides context sensitive solution to City's troublesome Intersection

DESIGNING A BETTER WAY

The Golden Hill Road/Union Road intersection was known as the "worst intersection in town." Constrained by existing development the highly skewed stop-controlled intersection caused driver confusion resulting in congestion and limiting accessibility for pedestrians and bicyclists. For years the City of Paso Robles evaluated potential improvements such as signalization, realignment, and a multilane roundabout; however, all options required extensive property acquisition and eventually stalled. The City then sought the expertise of the Wallace Group team to devise an innovative solution. The custom "dog bone" style roundabout eliminated property acquisition needs and saved the City millions of dollars. The team developed an innovative pavement structural design that allowed the re-use of on-site materials to reduce excavation, save time and money. During the reconstruction, the City also elected to replace aging City water lines and install new sewer and fiber optic facilities for planned development.
